Dr. Kate Bramham is a Consultant Nephrologist at King's College Hospital and an Associate Professor at King's College London. She serves as Deputy Director of the UK Rare Renal Disease Registry, Head of the CKD Genetics in Africa Group in the UK, and a member of the Health Inequalities Analysis Committee of the London Renal Network.

She is the author of several original manuscripts and book chapters on kidney disease, pregnancy, and ethnicity. Dr. Bramham leads multiple studies and clinical trials in the UK, Zambia, and Sierra Leone aimed at improving the early detection of kidney disease through point-of-care approaches and innovative treatments to protect kidney function in people of African ancestry. She is passionate about working closely with Black communities to change the trajectory of kidney disease.
